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Remote Education

Our remote offer was established at the start of the pandemic and developed to support learners who study with us in this way. Great creativity and professionalism have been invested in remote ways of delivering and interacting with our learners.

Access to helpful support documents

When you start your programme of study you will be able to set up access to eAssessor – an online portfolio in which your work will be kept securely. Your Course Tutors and Support Tutors will help you to do this.

eAssessor also gives you access to a wide range of support documents that have been written for you which can be read at your own convenience. Examples include our:

- Learner Handbook
- Safeguarding Handbook

Please take the time to familiarise yourself with these documents.

Learning is a two-way experience

Our Learner Charter sets out what you can expect of us and also what we expect from you while you are on programme. This document has been reviewed in light of the pandemic and we would appreciate all our learners taking the time to read it.

Digital platform

These include Zoom/Teams which are the digital platforms you could use during your study with us – both are reliable and effective online audio and video conferencing platform. Zoom/Team ‘meetings’ allow two or more people to communicate online.

Our staff team will provide support to help you become comfortable with its use and how to download the app if required. Your classes will take place in Zoom/Teams meetings set up by your Course Tutor and Support Tutors.

You can do many things using it includes:

- screen and app sharing
- video chat
- text chat
- group work
- tasks and assignments
- access course resources

Zoom/Teams are flexible and adaptable. You will need access to wifi and a device. It functions well and can be used on a range of devices including:

- smartphone

- tablet
- laptop
- desktop PC
- macs

Online classes are like being in an actual classroom. You will be able to see and interact with your tutor and other learners, and they will be able to see and interact with you.

The ground rules are the same as being in a physical classroom. Your tutor will review these at the start of and during your programme but generally you will be expected to be attentive, respect the opinions of others and participate in the learning activities organised for you. You can also submit tasks and assignments using Zoom/Teams. Your tutor will let you know how to do this using Zoom/Teams and how to use eAssessor referred to earlier.

Staying safe on-line

The internet is an important tool of modern times. However, it is also important to stay safe while on-line including when learning. All learners will receive awareness training during induction to help them stay safe on-line.

Release Potential Ltd is a Cyber Essentials certificated organisation. This is a UK wide government backed certification that helps companies to guard against common cyber threats.

Guidance, help and support

During the pandemic many people have used technology to a greater or lesser extent, including those who may not have used it in the past.

However, when things are new and unfamiliar, such as with remote learning, it can sometimes feel as if things are too much or too difficult. Our friendly staff are always there to help, support and guide you to get the most out of your programme.

We are aware that a few of you may be experiencing issues with access to suitable equipment, internet connections and even struggle to find somewhere to learn. We have been actively working with a number of partners in your area and have a number of potential solutions so that your learning is not interrupted or postponed.
